Effects Of Overexposure

Inhalation: Inhalation of MDI vapors may cause irritation of the mucous membranes of the

nose, throat, or trachea, breathlessness, chest discomfort, and difficulty breathing and reduced pulmonary function. Airborne exposure well above the PEL may result additionally in eye irritation, headache, chemical bronchitis, and asthma like findings or pulmonary edema. Isocyanates have also been reported to cause hypersensitivity pnemonitis, which is characterized by flu

like symptoms, the onset of which may be delayed.

carcinogenic at 6mg/m3, the highest dose tested. This is well above the recommended TLV of 5ppb (0.05mg/m3). Only irritation was noted at the lower concentrations of 0.2 and 1 mg/m3. No birth defects or teratogenic effects were reported in a teratology study with rats exposed to 1, 4, and 12mg/m3 polymeric MDI for 6hr/day on days 6 – 15 of gestation. As a result of repeated overexposure or a single large dose, certain individuals will develop isocyanate sensitization (chemical asthma) which will cause them to react to a later exposure to isocyanate levels at levels well below the PEL / TLV. These symptoms include chest tightness, wheezing, cough, shortness of breath, or asthma attack, which could be immediate or occur several hours after exposure. Chronic overexposure to isocyanates has also been reported to cause lung damage, including a decrease in lung function, which may be

permanent.
